# Two Types of Applicants

- Q: How the admission process is different from applying from the states vs applying from an international school
  - CA-Res vs Non-CA Res (Domestic Out-of-State and International Students)
  - Minimum requirements
- Q: I'm curious about how it works if we live here but have California state residency since we still pay taxes in California and own homes.
  - The term "California resident for purposes of tuition" is different from other definitions of California residence. For example, a person who is a California resident for tax or voting purposes is not necessarily a resident for purposes of tuition at the University of California. # Minimum Requirements

- Minimum UC GPA (grades earned after the summer of 9<sup>th</sup> grade and summer after 11<sup>th</sup> grade; weighted)
  - o 3.0 (CA Resident)
  - 3.4 (Nonresident)
- A-G Course Requirements
  - o A: History/Social Sciences 2 years required
  - o B: English, 4 years required
  - C: Mathematics, 3 years required (4 years recommended)
  - D: Science, 2 years required (3 years recommended)
  - o E: Language other than English, 2 years required (3 years recommended)
  - F: Visual and Performing Arts, 1 year required
  - G: College-Preparatory Elective, 1 year required
- UCI does not consider the SAT or ACT scores for admission or scholarship purposes
- UC does NOT have an Early Action (EA) or Early Decision (ED) process
- UC application is all self-reported. We do not ask students for recommendation letters.

## What are we looking for?

- We look for success by valuing multiple measures of achievement and promise:
  - Strong grades and course selection
  - Outstanding performance/achievement in academic subject areas or special projects and academic programs
  - o Special talents, achievements, and awards
- We consider the *context* in which each student has demonstrated academic and non-academic accomplishments:
  - o Educational and/or family environment
  - Available resources and opportunities
  - Any challenges the student has faced
  - Not just the Personal Insight Questions

- o Grade-Point Average
- Courses completed/planned beyond minimum A-G requirements
- o Approved honors, AP, IB, university courses
- Eligibility in the Local Context (ELC)\* applicable to CA-residents
- Quality of senior-year program of study
- Academic opportunities in secondary schools
- Outstanding performance in academic subject areas
- Achievements in special projects

- o Improvement in academic performance
- o Special talents, achievements, and awards
- o Participation in educational preparation programs
- o Academic accomplishment within life experiences
- o Geographic location
